FIGHTING MASS INCARCERATION AND DEPORTATION

Illinois Access to Justice is a state-wide program funded by the Illinois Department of Human Services that seeks to mitigate the devastating consequences of all forms of detention and incarceration and the resulting crippling effects on historically marginalized communities. Through a coalition of 59 community-centered organizations, we are expanding the network of holistic community-based legal services, including direct legal representation and education campaigns led by Community Navigators.

OUR RESPONSE TO COVID-19

With the outbreak of COVID-19 beginning in March 2020, ILA2J partners were quick to respond to the immediate needs of our community members. Our partners:

- Trained **916** emergency community navigators in response to COVID-19 to share critical information and resources in the hardest hit community areas
- Conducted mobile immigration screenings
- Fought to win the release of many who were incarcerated and in immigration detention
- Shared information on how and where to get tested for COVID-19
- Passed out meals while incorporating Know Your Rights information
- Assisted hundreds in applying for emergency financial assistance

STANDING TOGETHER FOR RACIAL JUSTICE

Over the past few months, we have witnessed ten of thousands of people throughout the country come together to call for racial justice and police accountability. Prior to the protests that followed the killing of George Floyd, we have witnessed how the COVID19 pandemic disproportionately affects communities of color.

ILA2J organizations stand with our communities during this time of hope and adversity. ILA2J providers have supported protesters through legal services and information, conducted mutual aid campaigns, and provided resources to community members.

On June 5th, Black and Brown mothers from Illinois Access to Justice partner organizations organized a march and vigil in solidarity with the Movement for Black Lives. Mothers from North and South Lawndale stood together, demanding justice.







COMMUNITIES IMPACTED BY INCARCERATION BY THE NUMBERS





IMMIGRATION CASES ACCEPTED FOR FULL REPRESENTATION

Of the 811 cases accepted, we served:

- 248 individuals in deportation proceedings
- **43** individuals currently in immigration detention
- And **87** asylum seekers

Our **331** Immigration Community Navigators that were recruited and trained in FY20 provided **4,273** individuals with accompaniment services to help them navigate the legal system and accessing other services critical to family stability.

While participating in an Expungement & Sealing Summit held in early 2020, a client began sharing her struggles with the Land of Lincoln attorney assigned to her case. It turned out that the client is currently raising two of her grandchildren, ages 4 and 5 years old. While she is their guardian, she wants to adopt them because their father/ her son is in prison, and the biological mother is absent. These children did not choose to have their lives upended by their father's incarceration. Being adopted by their grandmother provides the stability and security that all young children deserve. Land of Lincoln is currently assisting her in the adoption process.

NIJC's Detention Project continues to provide legal screenings and representation to detained individuals who remain in ICE custody as the coronavirus pandemic continues. Pro bono attorneys working through NIJC's Detention Project were able to secure the release of an NIJC client who spent almost a month in immigration detention after he was taken into ICE custody subsequent to a traffic stop in DuPage County.
