TRP HIGHLIGHTS

FEDERAL JUDGE STRIKES DOWN DACA PROGRAM

On Wednesday, September 13, 2023 a U.S. Federal Judge declared illegal a revised version of a federal policy that prevents the deportation of hundreds of thousands of DREAMers. TRP was proud to host Mayor Brandon Johnson in a roundtable discussion about the current efforts with migrants and the continued investment in the Legal Protection Fund. TRP STREET MASSES

Father Brendan Curran leads the message of peace and safety in our communities today. We are empowering our neighbors to do more in the community and address the problems in our streets. This summer, the community held 30 masses throughout Pilsen, Little Village, and West Town.

The mass held on August 25 in the Zocalo welcomed nearly 275 participants as we honored Father Don Nevins in recognition of his 50 years of ministry, leadership, and unwavering support of immigrant families in our community.

NAVIGATING THROUGH A FINANCIAL CRISIS: LIVE WEBINAR

ILLINOIS TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIP

TRP joined leaders of St. Sabina, Leo High School, and nearly 200 students and parents to advocate for the continuation of the Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship. Now in its sixth year, the Invest in Kids Act Tax Credit Scholarship program is in jeopardy, and 9,500 students from low-income families may lose their school scholarships and more than 26,000 students currently on the waitlist if the Illinois General Assembly fails to take action this November.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS



LATINAS LIDERES EN SALUD (LaLisa)

TRP is collaborating with **Dr. Yamilé Molina** and **the University of Illinois Cancer Center** to promote **LaLisa**, a research study for Latinas who have been diagnosed with breast cancer or have a family history of breast cancer and have not yet received genetic services. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH EVENT AT BENITO JUAREZ

TRP's Chicago Community Health Response Corps. (CCHRC) team met with students at Benito Juarez High School to discuss mental health and the available resources for them and their family. The also learned about additional resources such as emergency preparedness, food and meal assistance program, healthcare and medical bill assistance, affordable housing, immigration services for asylum seekers and refugees, and temporary and emergency cash assistance.





COMMUNITY SERVICES

The **HEALTHY CHICAGO EQUITY ZONE (HCEZ)** and the **CHICAGO COMMUNITY HEALTH RESPONSE CORP. (CCHRC)** are initiatives of TRP. The teams connect the community and TRP residents to these services and resources. We partner with organizations to increase mental health resources in the McKinley Park neighborhood and connect TRP tenants with public health employment and training opportunities to increase health resources in the community. We educate our community about COVID-19 and other public health threats in partnership with clinics, hospitals, and community organizations.
