PROPERTY TAX APPEALS

TRP's Full Circle Homes (FCH) program ensures households have the resources and support to purchase and stay in their homes long-term, and TRP's Financial Wellness team has been working with the Cook County Assessor's Office and the Cook County Board of Review to assist residents in lowering their property taxes.

Lake Township is open for appeals; **February 6, 2024**, is the deadline to file your appeal.

TRP staff is available to help with your appeal.



TRP LEGAL CLINIC

TRP continues to lead a coordinated effort to centralize application preparation via largescale workshops for recently arrived immigrants eligible for Temporary Protected Status and/or work permits via Parole. We continue collaborating closely with the State, City, legal service providers, and the Chicago Bar Foundation.

The HEALTHY CHICAGO EQUITY ZONE (HCEZ) is an initiative of TRP and partners with residents and organizations to increase mental health resources in the McKinley Park neighborhood. The health navigators have assisted in community outreach events and

resource fairs. The team has partnered with McKinley Park Library, San Miguel Church, and the Back of the Yards Library.

The CHICAGO COMMUNITY HEALTH RESPONSE CORP. (CCHRC) is an initiative of TRP that connects TRP tenants and Chicagoans with public health employment and training opportunities to increase health resources in the community. We educate our community about COVID-19 and other public health threats in partnership with clinics, hospitals, and community organizations. This month, the team co-hosted Bingo with Chicago Police Officers at TRP's Casa Maravilla and assisted TRP's Full Circle Homes team in preparing resident's tax appeals.


