The Resurrection Project's Official Statement Regarding the Car Crash Into Our Building

We are shocked and saddened that one of our buildings is a crime scene. In the early morning of Monday, September 30, 2024, a vehicle crashed into The Resurrection Project's immigrant justice offices at 1805 S. Ashland. We are working with officials from the Chicago Police Department and the City of Chicago as part of the investigation into a reported shooting that began near the West Loop.

The Resurrection Project is a social impact organization working on issues of affordable housing, community wellness, community organizing, and immigration to strengthen our community. We have been an anchor in Pilsen for nearly 35 years and have used this building to provide legal support and advocacy for immigrants for the last 15 years. Our building sustained substantial damage and must remain closed until further notice. We are sensitive that this incident has affected our clients and staff, and we are working with city officials to ensure that the building is secure, as safety is our number one priority. We are contacting our clients who have appointments in the next few weeks to let them know we will continue to service our families.

The Resurrection Project is fully cooperating with the ongoing police investigation. We are committed to supporting law enforcement in their efforts to bring justice and ensure the safety of our community.
