Hello friends and community,

TRP has been preparing immigrant communities for the second Trump administration; this is not what I wish we were doing. However, in the most challenging times, we have responded quickly, and this time is no different.

Immigrants come to the U.S. with big dreams. My parents came with big dreams, and even though we are still undocumented, they have fulfilled many of their dreams. They bought a home, they put their daughter through college, they spend weekends with family, and they feel a part of their community. My story isn't unique, so many immigrants have been able to build fulfilling and deeply connected lives. We need to help them prepare and we need to protect what they have built.

President-elect Donald Trump has made every indication that he intends to follow through with his campaign pledge to deport all undocumented immigrants beginning on day one. We could see mass deportations that will lead to the mass separation of families and all the consequences that come with family separation. This will also have an extremely negative impact on our local economy, businesses, and neighborhoods.

Ahead of the Trump administration's January 20 inauguration, TRP is launching a new campaign to expand legal services, make them easily available, and help provide access to critical information for immigrant families and their communities.

In Illinois, our immigrant communities are fortunate to have the support of the state government and many of our largest cities, including Chicago. TRP will work closely across all levels of local government and with our extensive network of non-profit community partners to support our most vulnerable community members should they be targeted or impacted by the new administration and its divisive and harmful agenda. Together, we will continue the work of uplifting the contributions and experiences of immigrants and championing immigrant justice for all.

As a central element of TRP's **Prepare and Protect Campaign**, we have launched a new website featuring a wide range of resources, including a comprehensive toolkit for immigrant families. This toolkit helps them protect their rights, prepare for emergencies, and navigate potential legal interactions with confidence and knowledge, <u>Know Your</u> <u>Rights — TRP IMMIGRANT JUSTICE</u>. Additionally, we will be expanding our defense team, launching rapid response legal workshops, and organizing to increase funding for Illinois Access to Justice.

Sometimes, I'm overwhelmed with dread and sadness, but mostly, I remember how much joy our families have. I remember how, despite our status, we manage to laugh (we even laugh at it), hustle, buy homes, put our children through college, change policy, and make big things happen. Let's keep doing that!

Domestic Violence Victims Get a Lifeline

The Resurrection Project's HOPE Family Services advocates for <u>Karina's Law (HB4144)</u>. Along with our partners at <u>The Network: Advocating Against Domestic Violence</u> and many community partners that champion survivors of gender-based violence, this legislation clarifies and strengthens the law to require firearms to be removed from the home as part of an order of protection when granted by a judge.

On July 3, 2023, Karina and her 15-year-old daughter Daniela were shot and killed by Karina's husband, even though she had filed for an order of protection that could have protected her from the firearm.

Karina's story is tragic, but she is not alone. In recent years, we have seen several homicides committed by abusers who were subject to an order of protection and should never have had access to a firearm, including China Mitchell, Julie Elguezabal, Adriana Lopez, Maria Roque, and others. Every day, domestic violence survivors and their children face increased threats when a firearm is in the home, even after an order of protection has been issued.

When domestic violence survivors go to the legal system for protection, we must ensure that protection works. TRP is proud to be part of this important work, and through programs like HOPE that serve domestic violence survivors, this bill will support their safety when they seek protection from the legal system.

Reclaiming Back of the Yards is an ambitious campaign to build hundreds of homes in Back of the Yards on Chicago's southwest side. The program ensures that those who already live and work in Back of the Yards have the resources and opportunities to purchase one of these affordable and newly constructed homes, keeping the neighborhood's revitalization in the hands of its own residents.




